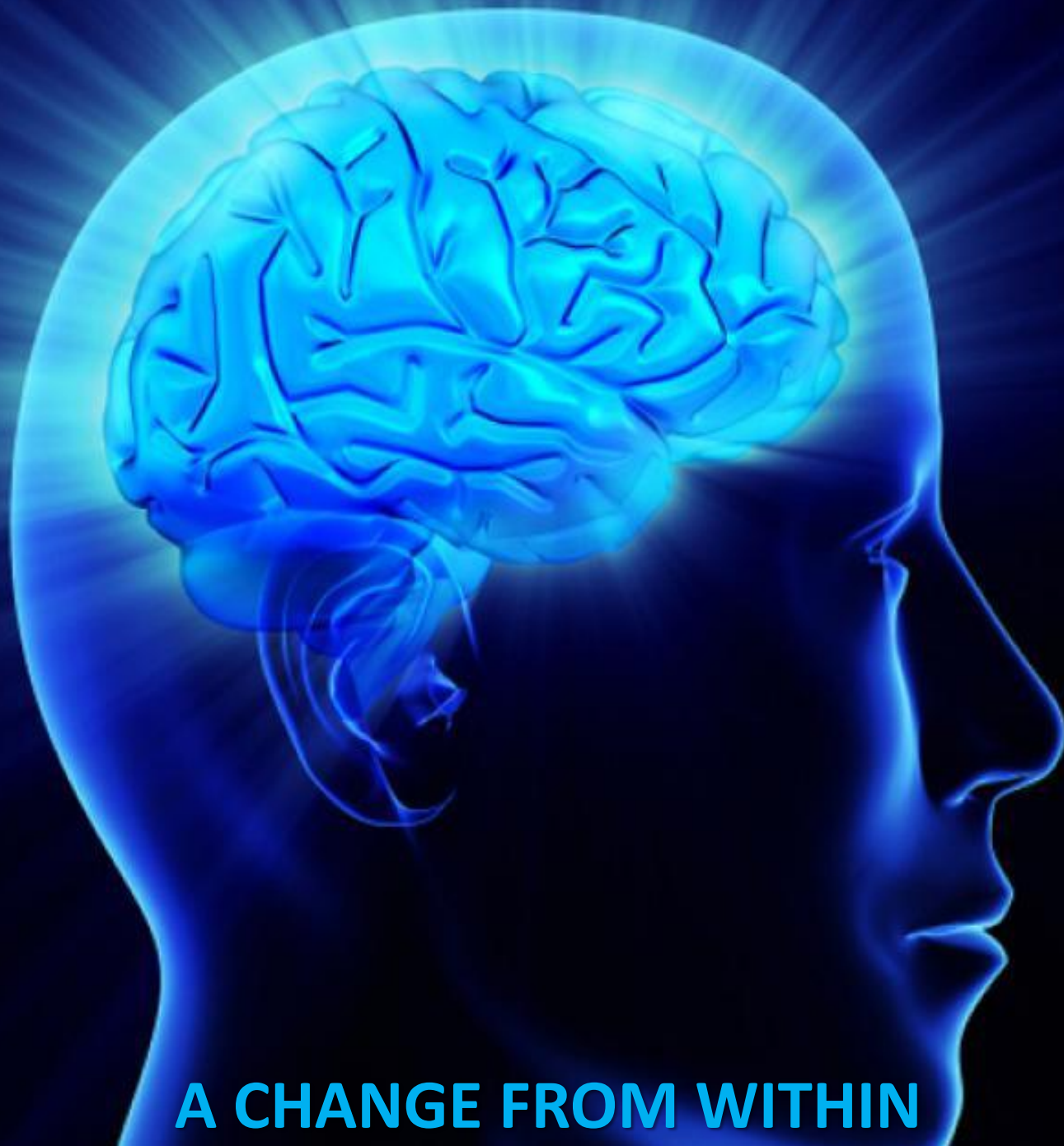

**Can our business endeavor be an overriding goal that unifies themes that give meaning not only to our daily activities but to the work life of those who work for us or with us?**



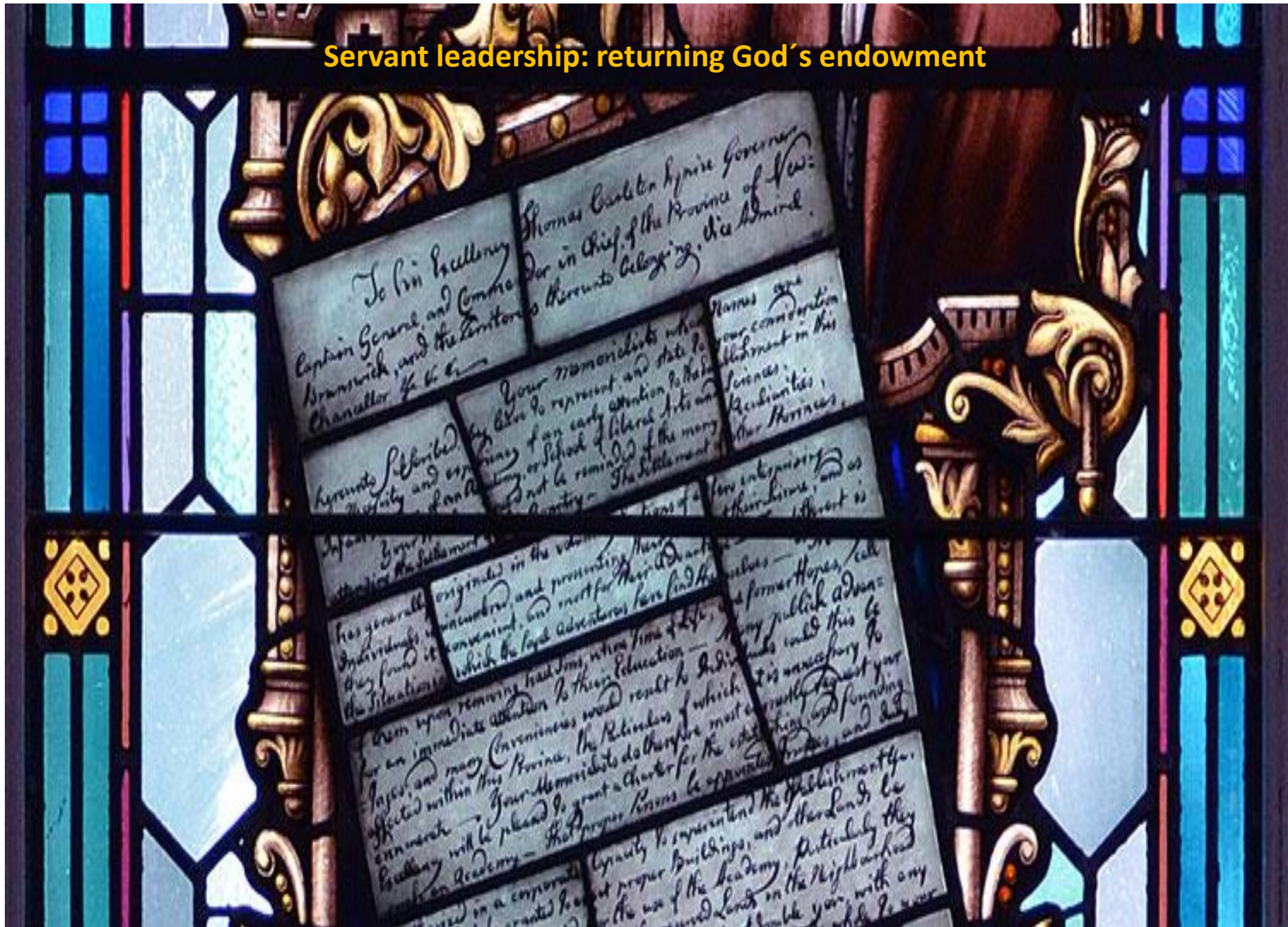
**There are many obstacles for business to serve the common good... for a Christian business leader the main personal obstacle is leading a divide life: the split between faith and daily business practice.**
